


STAFFING NEWS

UV PROTECTION: SUN SAFETY TIPS

When the UV index is 3 or higher, plan outdoor activities before 11 a.m. or after 4 p.m. Wide brimmed hats, long sleeve shirts, and long pants are recommended when possible. Find the shade as often as possible, drink large amounts of water, wear sunglasses, and apply generous amounts of sunscreen with a SPF of 15 or greater. All of these tips will help reduce the harmful effects caused by ultraviolet radiation of the sun's rays.



Note from TRI BOARD TRANSPORTATION

Effective immediately parents may submit applications directly to Tri-Board without the required school administrators' signature when:

- 1. The student is already enrolled at that school or**
- 2. the new/home and/or caregiver falls within the bussed area to that same school. For further clarity, the local school retains control of which students may attend their school with all out of bounds requests being referred back to the school for consideration.
